AS WE GATHER

The significance of Abram's faith is very important for us even today. God deals with Abram on the basis of faith. It is on the basis of faith that Abram is accounted righteous. Because the story of Abram is our story, we can understand that God deals with us in the same way that He dealt with Abram---**on the basis of faith**. This faith is not our work, but God's gift. Abram did not choose God; God chose Abram. Abram's faith was a result of God's gracious call. In like manner our faith is not a work of righteousness, it is a gift that comes to us from God, the result of God's gracious choice of us. Later in history God changes Abram's name to Abraham.

EPISTLE *Romans 4:1–8, 13–17* (The faith of Abraham is encouragement for us.)

Abraham was, humanly speaking, the founder of our Jewish nation. What did he discover about being made right with God? ² If his good deeds had made him acceptable to God, he would have had something to boast about. But that was not God's way. ³ For the Scriptures tell us, "Abraham believed God, and God counted him as righteous because of his faith."

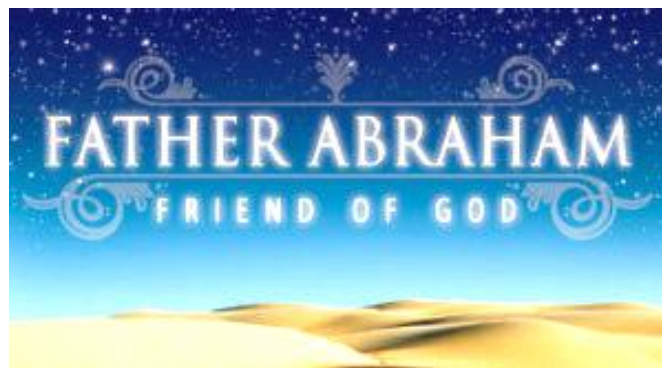
⁴ When people work, their wages are not a gift, but something they have earned. ⁵ But people are counted as righteous, not because of their work, but because of their faith in God who forgives sinners. ⁶ David also spoke of this when he described the happiness of those who are declared righteous without working for it:

⁷ "Oh, what joy for those
whose disobedience is forgiven,
whose sins are put out of sight.

⁸ Yes, what joy for those
whose record the Lord has cleared of sin."

HOLY GOSPEL *John 3:1–17*

Reader: Now there was a man of the Pharisees named Nicodemus, a ruler of the Jews. This man came to Jesus by night and said to Him, "Rabbi, we know that You are a teacher come from God, for no one can do these signs that you do unless God is with him." Jesus answered him, "Truly, truly, I say to you, unless one is born again he cannot see the kingdom of God." Nicodemus said to Him, "How can a man be born when he is old? Can he enter a second time into his mother's womb and be born?" Jesus answered, "Truly, truly, I say to you, unless one is born of water and the Spirit, he cannot enter the kingdom of God. That which is born of the flesh is flesh, and that which is born of the Spirit is spirit. Do not marvel that I said to you, 'You must be born again.' The wind blows where it wishes, and you hear its sound, but you do not know where it comes from or where it goes. So it is with everyone who is born of the Spirit."

Nicodemus said to him, "How can these things be?" Jesus answered him, "Are you the teacher of Israel and yet you do not understand these things? Truly, truly, I say to you, we speak of what we know, and bear witness to what we have seen, but you do not receive our testimony.

If I have told you earthly things and you do not believe, how can you believe if I tell you heavenly things? No one has ascended into heaven except He who descended from heaven, the Son of Man. And as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, that whoever believes in Him may have eternal life.

People: For God so loved the world, that He gave His only Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have eternal life. For God did not send His Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through Him.

Reader: This is the Gospel of the Lord.

New Year and Many Blessings for the Blessing Bag Street Mission in Detroit! Recently I was blessed with 30 (you heard that right) 30 “Sleeping bag coats” made by EMPOWERMENT PLAN in Detroit. At Empowerment Plan, they work to produce durable and innovative coats that transform into a sleeping bag. This employment opportunity ensures that each person they hire can earn a stable income, find secure housing, and regain their independence. Carol Howell (a former member and St. Paul employee) generously funded this venture! Although we are close to not needing warm jackets, stop by the parish hall to see the jackets and if you know of someone living on the streets,

please take one! We also continue to get the wonderful, heavy “Blessing Bags” you frequently see in the parish hall for our homeless friends. Each bag has three days or more of non-perishable food and hygiene items, in addition to seasonal necessities like gloves, hats and more! These bags are made by a group out of Ann Arbor called “God’s Sparrows” who made the non-profit specifically to make the bags for me/us to pass out to those who need them! Many other groups help with the Blessing Bag outreach, church groups and knitting groups make the hats and scarves, friends in the community fund needed items like flashlights and hygiene items- even families in the community have “go fund me” campaigns to assemble back packs full of items for our homeless friends!
