C: ⁴Yea, though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil; For You are with me; Your rod and Your staff, they comfort me.

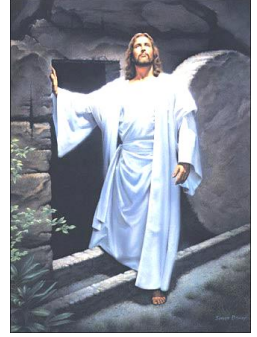
P: Oh sing to the Lord a new song; sing to the Lord, all the earth!

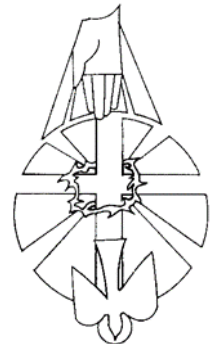
C: Hear us, Lord.
