AS WE GATHER

It would be a strange thing for God to send His Son to prepare the way of salvation for the world and then not give us a way to receive that salvation. "Christ also suffered once for sins, the righteous for the unrighteous, that He might bring us to God" (1 Peter 3:18). How does Jesus "bring us to God"? Peter says, "**Baptism . . . now saves you**" (1 Peter 3:21).

Here is the most important way Jesus sends the Helper, the Holy Spirit, who works repentance and faith in the heart. Saving faith is not a product of our own effort, decision, or desire. It is **always the gift of God**, continually renewed and strengthened by the Holy Spirit working through God's Word and Sacraments. As our Easter celebration continues, we are drawn closer to our Lord, who remains close to us, as He said, "I am with you always" (Matt. 28:20).

Again, we are urged to always be "prepared to make a defense to anyone who asks you for a reason for the hope that is in you" (1 Peter 3:15). As we share our hope in Christ, we are called to do so with gentleness and respect!

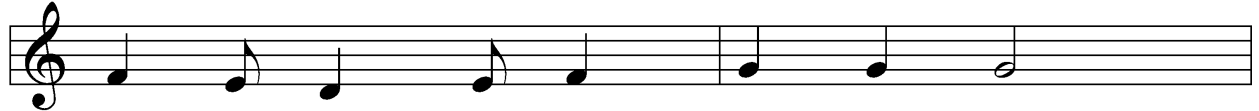

 **Endowment Fund News** 

It's amazing to think that our St. Paul Endowment Fund began in 2011 with a single donation of \$1,000. God has truly blessed this ministry! At the close of 2025, the Fund balance has grown to **\$109,234.86**, which will provide **\$5,450 in grant dollars for 2026**. Our 2026 grant window is now open between April 15th and May 31st, with award notifications being made by the end of June. Grant applications are available on the Narthex bulletin board and in the school office.

We are now entering our **fifth year of awarding grants**, and to date the Endowment Fund has shared more than **\$16,285** to support ministry, mission, and community outreach. Here are just a few of the projects that have been blessed through these funds:

Blessing Bag Corner News -

Missy Kreucher, a long time member facilitates making blessing bags at Mercy High School- “ In 2020, Mercy High School’s Honor Society was struggling for a way to earn community service points without engaging in the community. The introduction of the blessing bags allowed the girls an opportunity to support the community from a distance. Each blessing bag had very specific requirements, including hygiene, warm weather gear, and most importantly, a spiritual biblical message. One blessing bag equals one service point with a maximum of three allowed.

The blessing bags became an instant hit with the girls who needed to earn service points. Since 2020 we estimate Mercy High Schools National Honor Society has donated 350 blessing bags to the Detroit Street Mission. All blessing bags are delivered to St. Paul and distributed accordingly. During covid years we also let the girls earn points for making brownies. One student baked 1200 brownies for the mission. We gave 5 hours for every 100 brownies. “

Christ Our Savior Lutheran (14175 Farmington Rd, Livonia) will host an Ascension Day service on Thurs, **May 14** at 7pm. This holy day falls forty days after Easter and marks the end of Jesus’ ministry on earth. In this account, we see a glimpse of our Christ's exultation as the Lord who sits at the right hand of God. After this moment, the Holy Spirit was sent to the church to be their constant Comforter and Guide, a presence that continues into the life of our church today. What an occasion to celebrate!
