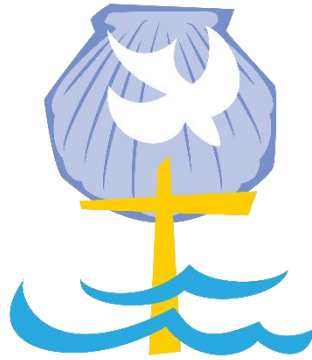

FIRST READING Galatians 6:1-10, 14-18 (*Bear One Another's Burdens*)

Reader: Dear brothers and sisters, if another believer is overcome by some sin, you who are godly should gently and humbly help that person back onto the right path. And be careful not to fall into the same temptation yourself. ² Share each other's burdens, and in this way obey the law of Christ.

People: ³ If you think you are too important to help someone, you are only fooling yourself. You are not that important.

Reader: ⁴ Pay careful attention to your own work, for then you will get the satisfaction of a job well done, and you won't need to compare yourself to anyone else.

**People: ⁵ For we are each responsible for our own conduct.
⁶ Those who are taught the word of God should provide for their teachers, sharing all good things with them.**

Reader: ⁷ Don't be misled—you cannot mock the justice of God. You will always harvest what you plant. ⁸ Those who live only to satisfy their own sinful nature will harvest decay and death from that sinful nature. But those who live to please the Spirit will harvest everlasting life from the Spirit.

**People: ⁹ So let's not get tired of doing what is good. At just the right time we will reap a harvest of blessing if we don't give up. ¹⁰ Therefore, whenever we have the opportunity, we should do good to everyone—especially to those in the family of faith.
¹⁴ As for me, may I never boast about anything except the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ. Because of that cross, my interest in this world has been crucified, and the world's interest in me has also died.**

Reader: ¹⁵ It doesn't matter whether we have been circumcised or not. What counts is whether we have been transformed into a new creation.
¹⁶ May God's peace and mercy be upon all who live by this principle; they are the new people of God. ¹⁷ From now on, don't let anyone trouble me with these things. For I bear on my body the scars that show I belong to Jesus.
¹⁸ Dear brothers and sisters, may the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ be with your spirit. Amen.

Reader: This is the Word of the Lord.

People: Thanks be to God.

HOLY GOSPEL Luke 10:1-12, 16-20 (*Jesus sends out the Seventy-Two*)

The Lord now chose seventy-two other disciples and sent them ahead in pairs to all the towns and places he planned to visit. ² These were his instructions to them: "The harvest is great, but the workers are few. So pray to the Lord who is in charge of the harvest; ask him to send more workers into his fields. ³ Now go, and remember that I am sending you out as lambs among wolves. ⁴ Don't take any money with you, nor a traveler's bag, nor an extra pair of sandals. And don't stop to greet anyone on the road.

⁵ "Whenever you enter someone's home, first say, 'May God's peace be on this house.' ⁶ If those who live there are peaceful, the blessing will stand; if they are not, the blessing will return to you. ⁷ Don't move around from home to home. Stay in one place, eating and drinking what they provide. Don't hesitate to accept hospitality, because those who work deserve their pay.

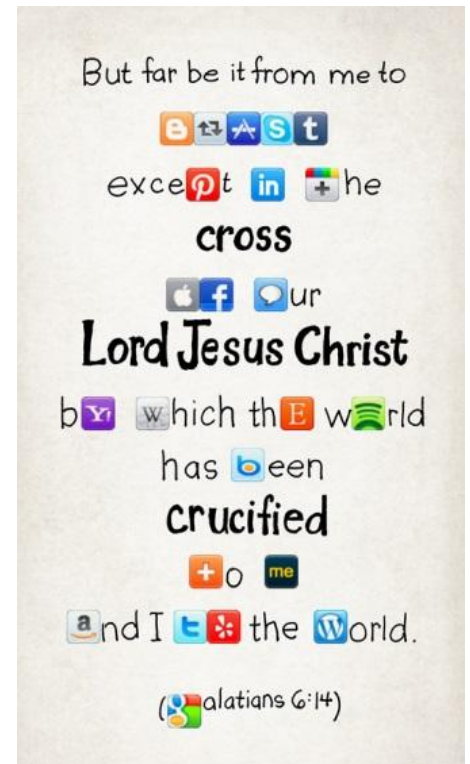
⁸ "If you enter a town and it welcomes you, eat whatever is set before you. ⁹ Heal the sick, and tell them, 'The Kingdom of God is near you now.' ¹⁰ But if a town refuses to welcome you, go out into its streets and say,

¹¹ 'We wipe even the dust of your town from our feet to show that we have abandoned you to your fate. And know this—the Kingdom of God is near!' ¹² I assure you, even wicked Sodom will be better off than such a town on judgment day.

¹⁶ Then he said to the disciples, "Anyone who accepts your message is also accepting me. And anyone who rejects you is rejecting me. And anyone who rejects me is rejecting God, who sent me."

¹⁷ When the seventy-two disciples returned, they joyfully reported to him, "Lord, even the demons obey us when we use your name!"

¹⁸ "Yes," he told them, "I saw Satan fall from heaven like lightning! ¹⁹ Look, I have given you authority over all the power of the enemy, and you can walk among snakes and scorpions and crush them. Nothing will injure you. ²⁰ But don't rejoice because evil spirits obey you; rejoice because your names are registered in heaven."



Reader: This is the Gospel of the Lord.

People: Praise to You, O Christ.

MESSAGE - Pastor Christopher Fairbairn

PRAYER OF THE CHURCH *Isaiah 66:12–13; Psalm 66:6; Galatians 6:2, 10; Luke 10:9*

Pastor: Let us use today's Scripture passages as the basis for our prayers for ourselves and all people. Behold, I will extend peace to her like a river.

People: Grant hopeful faith, Lord our God, to all who are not at peace this day. Give them strength to endure both national upheaval and internal stress as they await Your promised peace.

The national LWML Convention was held in Omaha, Nebraska June 26 - 29, 2025. The theme was "Growing in God's Grace" and focused on 1 Peter 3:18. 3,774 people attended, including St Paul's Barbara Hoffmeier. There are 40 districts in the national organization that vote on officers, bylaws, and mission grants every other year. She was an alternate for our Wayne Oak Hills Zone Delegate, Pat Schultz, from Shadow of the Cross Lutheran Church, Farmington. Some of her highlights were seeing her friends from all over the US, including many of the women that have gone on mission trips with her and singing in the choir with almost 300 women. There were many exhibitors and mission speakers that were inspiring, along with Bible Studies and entertainment. *The BIG NEWS is that 33 Mission Grants were selected to total \$2,622,270 for the next biennium.* Six of the recipients have Michigan connections, including grants for MOST Ministries and The Luke Clinic (Family of God.) As you contribute your MITES please remember our national and district grant recipients that are blessed with your contributions. *You can still view the videos on the website: www.lwml.org If you go to the Opening Service, scroll in 33 minutes to see the choir singing!* The next national convention will be July 8-11, 2027 in Oklahoma City. The next Michigan District LWML Convention will be June 24-26, 2026 in Lansing, MI.

We are called to spread the gospel, and one of the ways we can do so is to support LWML grants that enable the gospel to be preached throughout the world. For the month of July, Women in Christ is highlighting the mission grant for the Afghan Refugee Ministry (St. Michael Lutheran Church, Portage, MI) for the amount of \$25,000. The funds raised will support ministry to an extended Afghan refugee family in nearby Kalamazoo. With guidance from POBLO, the family patriarch, a Christian missionary, will receive assistance toward ordination as a Lutheran pastor through the Ethnic Immigrant Institute of Theology at Concordia Seminary, St. Louis. July is one of four times MITE boxes are collected during the year. Please place you filled MITE box in the large MITE box in the narthex.

Marcy also prepares our bag of supplies we take to serve the meal - paper plates, a plastic fork wrapped so nicely in a napkin, paper cups, take out boxes, and a bag of bags for people to take their take out boxes in. Marilyn Bruehan has been contributing neatly folded grocery bags that are always appreciated. The servers were Rich Mai, Kathy and Dennis Verseman, Barbara and Will Hoffmeier. We were able to stay for the worship service after the meal and meet the new Ft Wayne Seminary Graduate, Alex Ogden. He will be Ordained and Installed as the third Pastor at the Family of God soon, joining Pastor Jim Hill and Pastor Nick Gapski. God is working through this mission in southwest Detroit to feed many people their meals and also their spiritual food through His Word. It's a blessing to serve our brothers and sisters in Christ.
