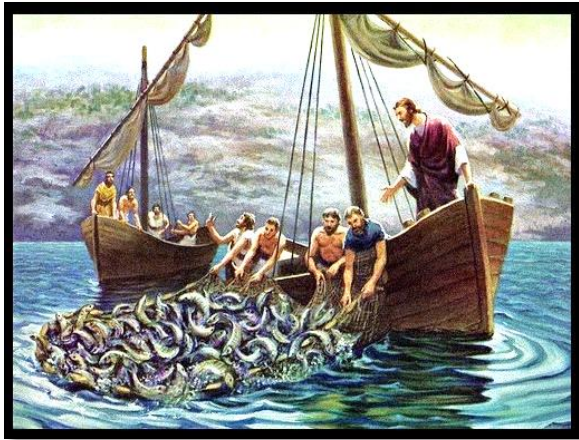

FIRST READING: *1 Corinthians 14:12–20*

(Paul talks about what it is that builds up the Church.)

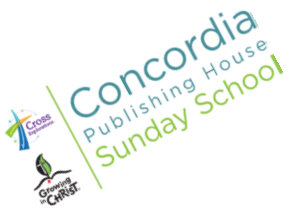

The last lesson the students talked about was “The Birth of John.” Zechariah spoke God’s Word announcing that this baby, John, would give people

knowledge of salvation in the forgiveness of sins. God speaks through His holy Word to give us knowledge of salvation and forgiveness through Jesus, His Son. In your family discuss, “How does Jesus remind us of the work He has done for us?”
