Reader: Seeing the crowds, He went up on the mountain, and when He sat down, His disciples came to Him. And He opened His mouth and taught them, saying: "Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

People: "Blessed are those who mourn, for they shall be comforted.

Reader: "Blessed are the meek, for they shall inherit the earth.

People: "Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they shall be satisfied.

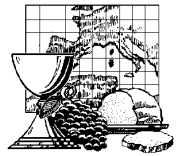
