I Struggle with Sin, Yet Rest in The Lord

**AS WE GATHER**

Paul is talking to himself in today's Epistle, for although he knows what's right, he finds it virtually impossible to do. That's because he (and all of us) have this sickness called sin, for which we ourselves have no antidote. Worse, it keeps producing evil symptoms in our thoughts, words, and deeds. As a result, we are both sick in spirit and tired from struggling. Zechariah foresaw the solution; we can see his prophecy fulfilled as Jesus entered Jerusalem on Palm Sunday, there to die for us and rise victorious. In the Gospel, our Lord thanks our heavenly Father for revealing to us that He is indeed the One we need to overcome our sickness of sin. Indeed, thanks to our Savior, as David penned in the psalm, that when people call out to Him, God hears their cry and saves them.

Elder: <sup>15</sup> I do not understand what I do.  
Pastor: *For what I want to do I do not do, but I hate to do.*

Elder: <sup>16</sup> And if I do what I do not want to do, I agree that the law is good.  
Pastor: <sup>17</sup> *As it is, it is no longer I myself who do it, but it is sin living in me.*

Elder: <sup>18</sup> For I know that good itself does not dwell in me, that is, in my sinful  
nature.  
Pastor: ***For I have the desire to do what is good, but I cannot carry it out.***

Elder: <sup>19</sup> For I do not do the good I want to do,  
Pastor: ***but the evil I do not want to do – this I keep on doing.***

Elder: <sup>20</sup> Now if I do what I do not want to do, it is no longer I who do it,  
Pastor: *but it is sin living in me that does it.*

Elder: <sup>21</sup> So I find this law at work: Although I want to do good, evil is right there with me.

Pastor: <sup>22</sup> *For in my inner being I delight in God's law;*

Elder: <sup>23</sup> but I see another law at work in me, waging war against the law of my mind and making me a prisoner of the law of sin at work within me.

**Elder & Pastor: *Thanks be to God, who delivers me through Jesus Christ our Lord!***

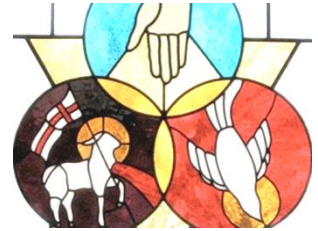

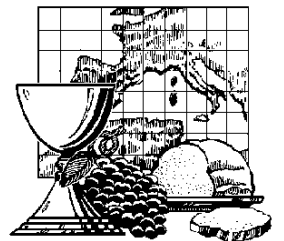

**Blessing Bags** – Have you ever wondered what “Blessing Bags” are and who “gets” Blessing Bags? Blessing Bags are bags filled with non-perishable food (i.e. nuts, beef jerky, cracker kits, fruit rolls) hygiene items (i.e. toothpaste, soap, shampoo, wipes, toilet paper, combs, deodorant) sometimes t-shirts, flip flops, rain ponchos, gloves, emergency blankets, socks and more! The homeless and less fortunate on the streets of Detroit are the recipients of these bags. St. Paul Lutheran Church has it's own “Blessing Bag Closet” – a

large amount of the items for the bags are funded and purchased by the St. Paul Board of Evangelism, members, friends outside of St. Paul and other non-profits (i.e The Good Karma Club, Knitting Groups).
