But we do know that we will be like him, for we will see him as he really is. ³ And all who have this eager expectation will keep themselves pure, just as he is pure.

⁴ Everyone who sins is breaking God's law, for all sin is contrary to the law of God. ⁵ And you know that Jesus came to take away our sins, and there is no sin in him. ⁶ Anyone who continues to live in him will not sin. But anyone who keeps on sinning does not know him or understand who he is.

⁷ Dear children, don't let anyone deceive you about this: When people do what is right, it shows that they are righteous, even as Christ is righteous.

Holy Gospel *Luke 24:36–49* (Jesus appears to His disciples.)

Reader:³⁶ And just as they were telling about it, Jesus himself was suddenly standing there among them.

PEOPLE: “Peace be with you,” he said.³⁷ **But the whole group was startled and frightened, thinking they were seeing a ghost!**

Reader:³⁸ “Why are you frightened?” he asked. “Why are your hearts filled with doubt? ³⁹ Look at my hands. Look at my feet. You can see that it’s really me. Touch me and make sure that I am not a ghost, because ghosts don’t have bodies, as you see that I do.” ⁴⁰ As he spoke, he showed them his hands and his feet.

PEOPLE: ⁴¹ **Still they stood there in disbelief, filled with joy and wonder. Then he asked them, “Do you have anything here to eat?”⁴² They gave him a piece of broiled fish, ⁴³ and he ate it as they watched.**

Reader:⁴⁴ Then he said, “When I was with you before, I told you that everything written about me in the law of Moses and the prophets and in the Psalms must be fulfilled.”⁴⁵ Then he opened their minds to understand the Scriptures. ⁴⁶ And he said, “Yes, it was written long ago that the Messiah would suffer and die and rise from the dead on the third day.⁴⁷ It was also written that this message would be proclaimed in the authority of his name to all the nations, beginning in Jerusalem:

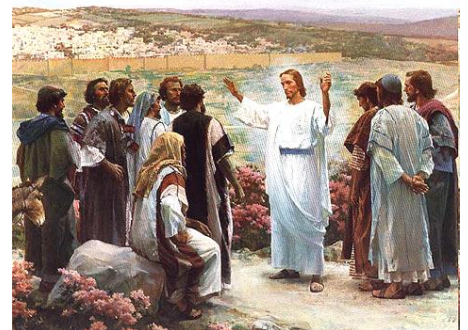

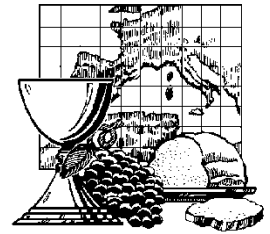

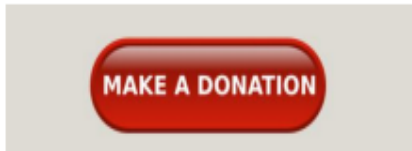
