CONFESSION AND ABSOLUTION

Pastor: Let us now make confession of our sins to God, our heavenly Father.

People: Merciful Lord, we confess that we are by nature sinful and unclean. We admit that we have sinned against You in thought, word, and deed. We have left undone those things which we ought to have done; we have done those things which we ought not to have done. We have not always shaped our lives around the Gospel and have not always shared our faith as opportunity was given to us. We have not always been generous in sharing the bounty You have given us. We sincerely repent of our sins and humbly ask Your grace and forgiveness in Jesus Christ. By the renewing work of the Holy Spirit, lead us to change what is sinful in our lives that each day we may grow in righteousness and godly living to the glory of Your holy name.

Pastor: God has gathered His people from north and south, east and west, and to them says, "Fear not!" In His mercy He promises pardon, life, and salvation because of the atoning sacrifice of His beloved Son. As a called servant of Christ, I announce to you the forgiveness of all of your sins in the name of the Father and of the ✠ Son and of the Holy Spirit.

As you believe, so may it be.

People: Amen.

OPENING SEQUENCE *Job 26:7; Jeremiah 47:2; Ezekiel 1:4; Isaiah 49:11–12*

Pastor: The season of Epiphany is a time when the Lord Jesus Christ is more fully known, and we celebrate the expanding of the Gospel throughout the world. We rejoice that the Word of God has reached every corner of the world and that all people may share in the Good News of salvation.

Elder: *Today our compass points to the north as when we celebrate the Baptism of the Lord. In describing the creation of the world, Job relates that the Lord "stretches out the north over the void and hangs the earth on nothing." The prophet Jeremiah writes of waters rising out of the north, and Ezekiel's vision of the glory of the Lord begins as "a stormy wind came out of the north." The prophet Isaiah has words of encouragement about the redeemed people of God:*

All: **"And I will make all My mountains a road, and My highways shall be raised up. Behold, these shall come from afar, and behold, these from the north and from the west . . ."**

Pastor: We sing a mission hymn to every place in the world about the bringing of important news: the sacrifice of our Lord on the cross brings us life!

PRAYER OF THE DAY

Pastor: Gracious God, in the Baptism of our Lord Jesus in the Jordan River You affirmed Him as Your beloved Son. Set free from fear all who are baptized in His name that they may fearlessly make known Your words of life; through the same Jesus Christ, our Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

People: **We too, are baptized into His death and resurrection. Amen.**

OLD TESTAMENT READING *Isaiah 43: 1–7* (The Lord has called Israel by name.)

But now, O Jacob, listen to the Lord who created you.

O Israel, the one who formed you says, "Do not be afraid, for I have ransomed you. I have called you by name; you are mine.

² When you go through deep waters, **I will be with you.**

When you go through rivers of difficulty, you will not drown.

When you walk through the fire of oppression, you will not be burned up; the flames will not consume you. ³ For I am the Lord, your God, the Holy One of Israel, your Savior. I gave Egypt as a ransom for your freedom; I gave Ethiopia and Seba in your place.

⁴ Others were given in exchange for you.

⁵ "Do not be afraid, for **I am with you.**

FIRST READING *Romans 6:1–11* (We are made to walk in newness of life in Christ.)

Reader: Well then, should we keep on sinning so that God can show us more and more of his wonderful grace?

People: ² **Of course not! Since we have died to sin, how can we continue to live in it?**

Reader: ³ Or have you forgotten that when we were joined with Christ Jesus in baptism, we joined him in his death? ⁴ For we died and were buried with Christ by baptism. And just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glorious power of the Father, now we also may live new lives.

People: ⁵ **Since we have been united with him in his death, we will also be raised to life as he was.** ⁶ **We know that our old sinful selves were crucified with Christ so that sin might lose its power in our lives. We are no longer slaves to sin.**

Reader: ⁷ For when we died with Christ we were set free from the power of sin.
⁸ And since we died with Christ, we know we will also live with him. ⁹ We are sure of this because Christ was raised from the dead, and he will never die again. Death no longer has any power over him. ¹⁰ When he died, he died once to break the power of sin. But now that he lives, he lives for the glory of God. ¹¹ So you also should consider yourselves to be dead to the power of sin and alive to God through Christ Jesus.

Reader: This is the Word of the Lord.

People: Thanks be to God!

HOLY GOSPEL *Luke 3:15–22* (Jesus teaches we must be born of water and Spirit.)

¹⁵ Everyone was expecting the Messiah to come soon, and they were eager to know whether John might be the Messiah. ¹⁶ John answered their questions by saying, "I baptize you with water; but someone is coming soon who is greater than I am—so much greater that I'm not even worthy to be his slave and untie the straps of his sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and with fire.

¹⁷ He is ready to separate the chaff from the wheat with his winnowing fork. Then he will clean up the threshing area, gathering the wheat into his barn but burning the chaff with never-ending fire." ¹⁸ John used many such warnings as he announced the Good News to the people.

¹⁹ John also publicly criticized Herod Antipas, the ruler of Galilee, for marrying Herodias, his brother's wife, and for many other wrongs he had done. ²⁰ So Herod put John in prison, adding this sin to his many others.

²¹ One day when the crowds were being baptized, Jesus himself was baptized. As he was praying, the heavens opened, ²² and the Holy Spirit, in bodily form, descended on him like a dove. And a voice from heaven said, "You are my dearly loved Son, and you bring me great joy.
