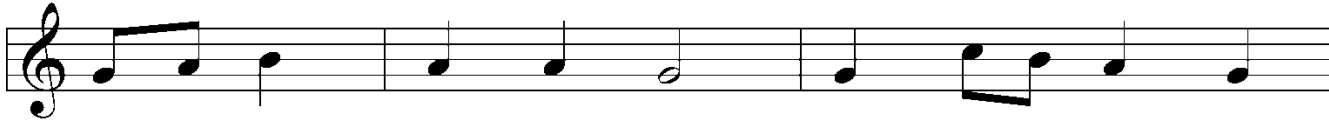

OLD TESTAMENT READING *Isaiah 42:14–21* (The Lord will turn darkness into light.)

¹⁴ He will say, "I have long been silent;
yes, I have restrained myself.
But now, like a woman in labor,
I will cry and groan and pant.
¹⁵ I will level the mountains and hills
and blight all their greenery.
I will turn the rivers into dry land
and will dry up all the pools.
¹⁶ I will lead blind Israel down a new path,
guiding them along an unfamiliar way.
I will brighten the darkness before them
and smooth out the road ahead of
them. Yes, I will indeed do these things;
I will not forsake them.

¹⁷ But those who trust in idols, who say,
'You are our gods,' will be turned away in
shame.
¹⁸ "Listen, you who are deaf! Look and see,
you blind! ¹⁹ Who is as blind as my own
people, my servant? Who is as deaf as my
messenger? Who is as blind as my
chosen people, the servant of the Lord?
²⁰ You see and recognize what is right
but refuse to act on it. You hear with
your ears, but you don't really listen."
²¹ Because he is righteous, the Lord has
exalted his glorious law.

Reader: This is the Word of the Lord.

People: **Thanks be to God!**

EPISTLE READING *Ephesians 5:8–14* (Walking as children of the light)

Reader: ⁸ for at one time you were darkness, but now you are light in the Lord. Walk as children of light ⁹ (for the fruit of light is found in all that is good and right and true), ¹⁰ and try to discern what is pleasing to the Lord. ¹¹ Take no part in the unfruitful works of darkness, but instead expose them. ¹² For it is shameful even to speak of the things that they do in secret.

People: ¹³ **But when anything is exposed by the light, it becomes visible,** ¹⁴ **for anything that becomes visible is light. Therefore it says, “Awake, O sleeper, and arise from the dead, and Christ will shine on you.”**

Reader: This is the Word of the Lord.

People: Thanks be to God!

HOLY GOSPEL *John 9:1–41* (Jesus heals a man who was born blind.)

Reader: As Jesus was walking along, he saw a man who had been blind from birth.

People: ² **“Rabbi,” his disciples asked him, “why was this man born blind? Was it because of his own sins or his parents’ sins?”**

Reader: ³ “It was not because of his sins or his parents’ sins,” Jesus answered. “This happened so the power of God could be seen in him.” ⁴ We must quickly carry out the tasks assigned us by the one who sent us. The night is coming, and then no one can work. ⁵ But while I am here in the world, I am the light of the world.”

⁶ Then he spit on the ground, made mud with the saliva, and spread the mud over the blind man’s eyes. ⁷ He told him, “Go wash yourself in the pool of Siloam” (Siloam means “sent”). So the man went and washed and came back seeing! ⁸ His neighbors and others who knew him as a blind beggar asked each other,

People: **“Isn’t this the man who used to sit and beg?”⁹ Some said he was, and others said, “No, he just looks like him!”**

But the beggar kept saying, “Yes, I am the same one!”

¹⁰ They asked, “Who healed you? What happened?”

Reader: ¹¹ He told them, “The man they call Jesus made mud and spread it over my eyes and told me, ‘Go to the pool of Siloam and wash yourself.’ So I went and washed, and now I can see!”

¹² “Where is he now?” they asked. “I don’t know,” he replied.

¹³ Then they took the man who had been blind to the Pharisees,¹⁴ because it was on the Sabbath that Jesus had made the mud and healed him. ¹⁵ The Pharisees asked the man all about it. So he told them, “He put the mud over my eyes, and when I washed it away, I could see!”

¹⁶ Some of the Pharisees said, “This man Jesus is not from God, for he is working on the Sabbath.” Others said,

People: **“But how could an ordinary sinner do such miraculous signs?”**

Reader: So there was a deep division of opinion among them.

¹⁷ Then the Pharisees again questioned the man who had been blind and demanded, “What’s your opinion about this man who healed you?” The man replied, “I think he must be a prophet.”

Reader: ¹⁸ The Jewish leaders still refused to believe the man had been blind and could now see, so they called in his parents. ¹⁹ They asked them, “Is this your son? Was he born blind? If so, how can he now see?” ²⁰ His parents replied,

People: **“We know this is our son and that he was born blind,²¹ but we don’t know how he can see or who healed him. Ask him. He is old enough to speak for himself.”**

Reader: ²² His parents said this because they were afraid of the Jewish leaders, who had announced that anyone saying Jesus was the Messiah would be expelled from the synagogue.²³ That’s why they said, “He is old enough. Ask him.”

²⁴ So for the second time they called in the man who had been blind and told him, "God should get the glory for this, because we know this man Jesus is a sinner."

People: ²⁵ **"I don't know whether he is a sinner," the man replied. "But I know this: I was blind, and now I can see!"**

Reader: ²⁶ "But what did he do?" they asked. "How did he heal you?"

People: ²⁷ **"Look!" the man exclaimed. "I told you once. Didn't you listen? Why do you want to hear it again? Do you want to become his disciples, too?"**

Reader: ²⁸ Then they cursed him and said, "You are his disciple, but we are disciples of Moses! ²⁹ We know God spoke to Moses, but we don't even know where this man comes from." ³⁰ "Why, that's very strange!" the man replied. "He healed my eyes, and yet you don't know where he comes from? ³¹ We know that God doesn't listen to sinners, but he is ready to hear those who worship him and do his will. ³² Ever since the world began, no one has been able to open the eyes of someone born blind. ³³ If this man were not from God, he couldn't have done it."

Reader: ³⁴ "You were born a total sinner!" they answered. "Are you trying to teach us?" And they threw him out of the synagogue.

Spiritual Blindness

³⁵ When Jesus heard what had happened, he found the man and asked, "Do you believe in the Son of Man?" ³⁶ The man answered, "Who is he, sir? I want to believe in him." ³⁷ "You have seen him," Jesus said, "and he is speaking to you!"

³⁸ "Yes, Lord, I believe!" the man said. And he worshiped Jesus. ³⁹ Then Jesus told him, "I entered this world to render judgment—to give sight to the blind and to show those who think they see that they are blind."

⁴⁰ Some Pharisees who were standing nearby heard him and asked, "Are you saying we're blind?"

People: ⁴¹ "If you were blind, you wouldn't be guilty," Jesus replied. "But you remain guilty because you claim you can see."

Reader: This is the Gospel of the Lord.

People: Praise to You, O Christ.

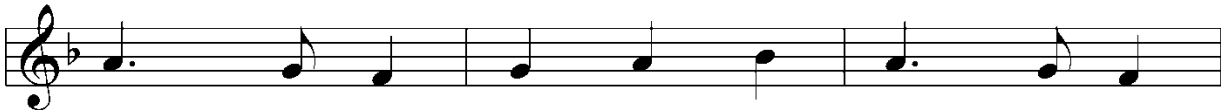

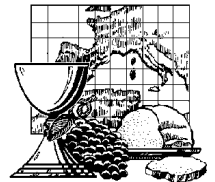

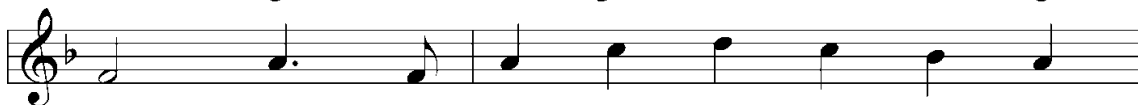
