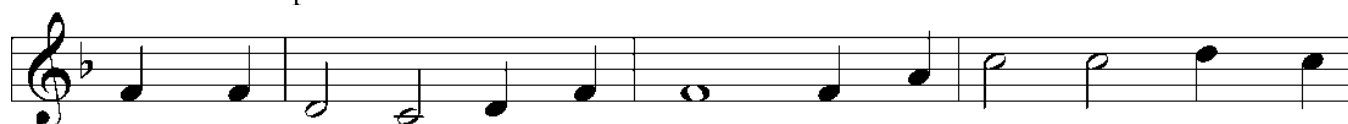

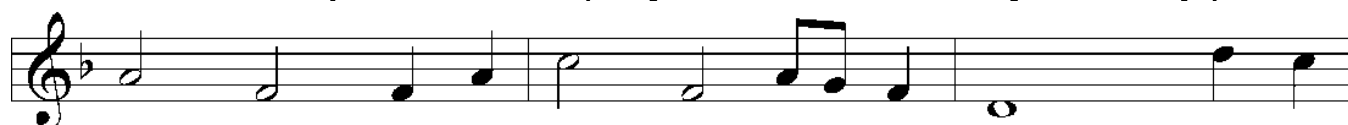

OLD TESTAMENT READING Nehemiah 8:1–3, 5–6, 8–10

(They taught the Word of the Lord clearly so that the people might understand.)

Reader: ¹ All the people came together as one in the square before the Water Gate. They told Ezra the teacher of the Law to bring out the Book of the Law of Moses, which the Lord had commanded for Israel.

² So on the first day of the seventh month Ezra the priest brought the Law before the assembly, which was made up of men and women and all who were able to understand.

People: ³ He read it aloud from daybreak till noon as he faced the square before the Water Gate in the presence of the men, women and others who could understand. And all the people listened attentively to the Book of the Law.

Reader: ⁵ Ezra opened the book. All the people could see him because he was standing above them; and as he opened it, the people all stood up. ⁶ Ezra praised the Lord, the great God; and all the people lifted their hands and responded,

People: “Amen! Amen!” Then they bowed down and worshiped the Lord with their faces to the ground.

⁸ They read from the Book of the Law of God, making it clear and giving the meaning so that the people understood what was being read.

Reader: ⁹ Then Nehemiah the governor, Ezra the priest and teacher of the Law, and the Levites who were instructing the people said to them all, “This day is holy to the Lord your God. Do not mourn or weep.” For all the people had been weeping as they listened to the words of the Law.

¹⁰ Nehemiah said, “Go and enjoy choice food and sweet drinks, and send some to those who have nothing prepared. This day is holy to our Lord. Do not grieve, for the joy of the Lord is your strength.”

Reader: This is the Word of the Lord.

People: Thanks be to God!

EPISTLE READING 1 Corinthians 12:12–31 (Each of us is a part of the Body of Christ.)

Reader: ¹² The human body has many parts, but the many parts make up one whole body. So it is with the body of Christ. ¹³ Some of us are Jews, some are Gentiles, some are slaves, and some are free. But we have all been baptized into one body by one Spirit, and we all share the same Spirit.

¹⁴ Yes, the body has many different parts, not just one part. ¹⁵ If the foot says, "I am not a part of the body because I am not a hand," that does not make it any less a part of the body. ¹⁶ And if the ear says, "I am not part of the body because I am not an eye," would that make it any less a part of the body? ¹⁷ If the whole body were an eye, how would you hear? Or if your whole body were an ear, how would you smell anything?

¹⁸ But our bodies have many parts, and God has put each part just where he wants it. ¹⁹ How strange a body would be if it had only one part!

²⁰ Yes, there are many parts, but only one body. ²¹ The eye can never say to the hand, "I don't need you." The head can't say to the feet, "I don't need you."

People: ²² **In fact, some parts of the body that seem weakest and least important are actually the most necessary.** ²³ **And the parts we regard as less honorable are those we clothe with the greatest care. So we carefully protect those parts that should not be seen,** ²⁴ **while the more honorable parts do not require this special care. So God has put the body together such that extra honor and care are given to those parts that have less dignity.** ²⁵ **This makes for harmony among the members, so that all the members care for each other.** ²⁶ **If one part suffers, all the parts suffer with it, and if one part is honored, all the parts are glad.**

Reader: ²⁷ All of you together are Christ's body, and each of you is a part of it.
²⁸ Here are some of the parts God has appointed for the church:
 first are apostles, second are prophets, third are teachers, then those
 who do miracles, those who have the gift of healing, those who can help
 others, those who have the gift of leadership, those who speak in
 unknown languages.

²⁹ Are we all apostles? Are we all prophets? Are we all teachers? Do we
 all have the power to do miracles? ³⁰ Do we all have the gift of healing?
 Do we all have the ability to speak in unknown languages? Do we all
 have the ability to interpret unknown languages? Of course not! ³¹ So
 you should earnestly desire the most helpful gifts.

Reader: This is the Word of the Lord.

People: Thanks be to God!

²³ And he said to them, "Doubtless you will quote to me this proverb, 'Physician, heal yourself.' What we have heard you did at Capernaum, do here in your hometown as well." ²⁴ And he said, "Truly, I say to you, no prophet is acceptable in his hometown.

²⁵ But in truth, I tell you, there were many widows in Israel in the days of Elijah, when the heavens were shut up three years and six months, and a great famine came over all the land, ²⁶ and Elijah was sent to none of them but only to Zarephath, in the land of Sidon, to a woman who was a widow.

²⁷ And there were many lepers in Israel in the time of the prophet Elisha, and none of them was cleansed, but only Naaman the Syrian."

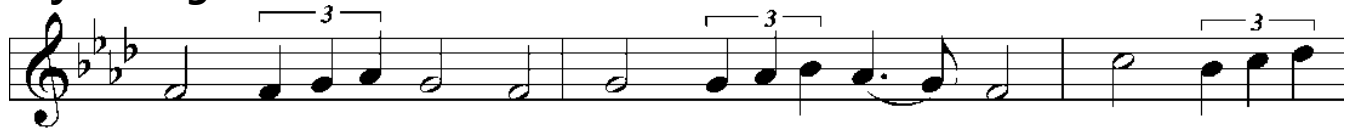

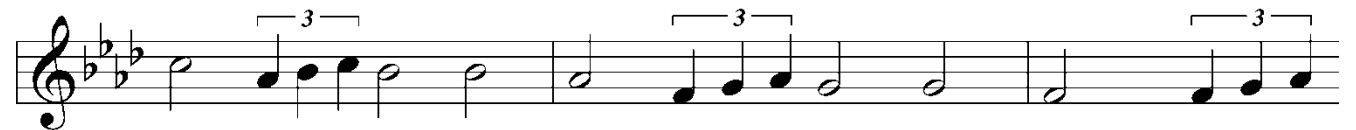

St. Paul's Endowment Fund was blessed with another great year of donations not to mention some good growth from the stock market. Our 2024 year end balance is **\$96,665.36** which generates **\$4825** in grant dollars available for 2025.
