Stand Firm in the Faith

As We Gather

God's Old Testament people wouldn't listen to His Word, but sought other gods. When Jeremiah pronounced judgment, they were ready to put him to death. When God's Son came, it was only appropriate that He should be executed just outside Jerusalem by the very people He sought to save. We need to examine whether we are open to God's guidance, avoiding "earthly things," as Paul warns. We dare not be as a reluctant brood—chicks scattering while our Lord would gather us under His protecting wings.

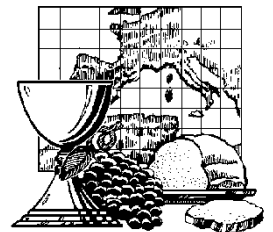

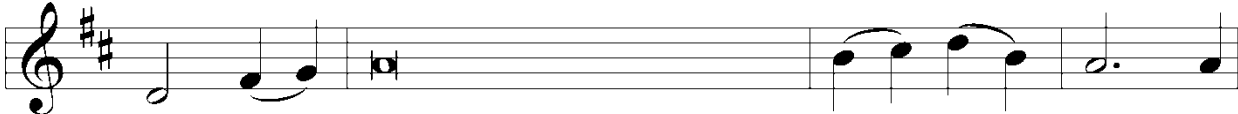
